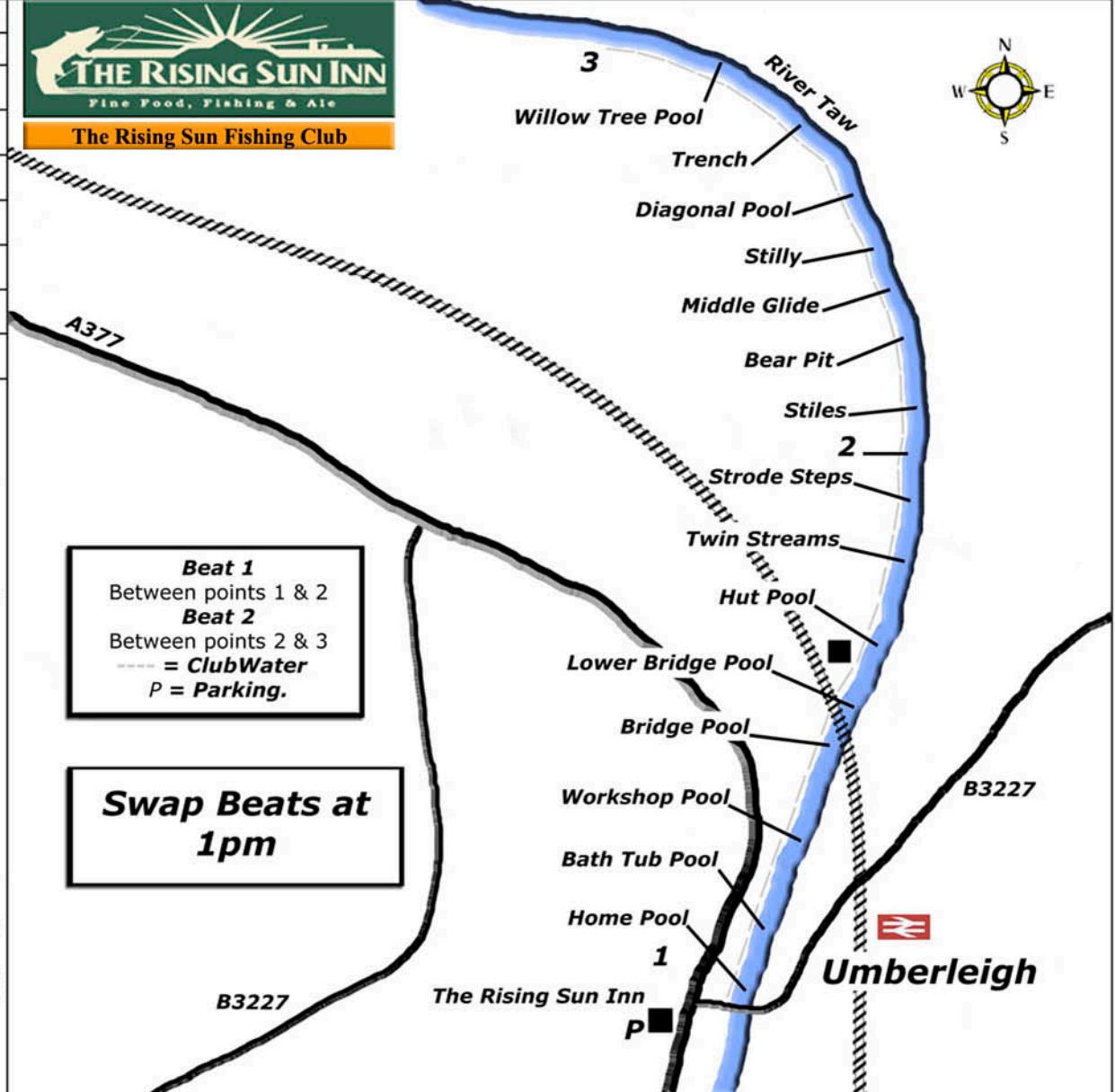

Beat 1

Home Pool
Good at all heights but especially when it is high. You can fish this even up to 1 metre on the gauge. Don't wade below the access slope at this height though. The fish are generally found between the two green rain water down pipes on the antiques warehouse. In normal height of water (4.5 on gauge) it is well worth fishing down, and covering under the trees on the other bank down to the rail.

Bath Tubs
As you wade down this pool you will discover a cast iron bath on your way, hence the name. At it's best when the rock half way down is covered. The fish tend to be just to the right of the rock to ten yards below. Not a particularly nice wade.

Workshop
Good for sea trout and grilse normally found the lower half of the pool. Definitely worth a cast in high water when they lay up in the tail of the pool almost on the lip in the centre.

Bridge Pool
Mid way down and mid way across is the main lie but they can be found anywhere in this pool, including the neck in front of the bridge supports. Especially the one on our side. Fish this pool mainly from the bank

Hut Pool
This is closest. Three pools in one. The first pool is directly below the bridge. The fish lie up under the trees to the centre of the run. In normal height of water wade to the gravel bank half way across and you can wade down heading gradually back to our bank. This then turns into a run that is deepest on the other bank and the fish tend to lie up next to it. Well worth fishing this wait a table fly (even in low water) to set some depth quickly.

Hut Pool (cont'd)
This run then opens out into a wide pool. In low to medium height the fish will be found 2/3 of the way over, just of the trees. In high water the fish will be 10'-15' out from our bank, so let your fly come right around on the dangle. Fish this pool to the tail. It can also be a very good night time sea trout destination. 3 sea trout over 10lbs have been caught here in the last few years.

Twin Streams
In the top half of the pool the fish tend to be found in the stream on our bank and as you get towards the tail in the middle to the far bank. There is a ledge on our side in the tail so it's worth letting your fly come right across.

Strode Steps
The river narrows radically here guaranteeing a good flow and depth even in low water. This pool can be waded in normal height but in high water fish it from the bank.

Beat 2

Stiles
The Strode Steps flows into Stiles and streamy water at the neck can often hold a fish. The Stiles is worth fishing all the way down to the Bear Pitt. It's a deep wade but can be fished from the bank. Good for a day time sea trout as it's quite shaded here.

Bear Pit
Fish can be found in this pool from the V in the neck right the way down to the Glide. The top half of the pool can be waded and then fish it from the bank. Level with the stile on our side can be a very good lie. A great pool to play a fish in as they normally use the fast stream of the neck to their advantage.

Middle Glide
With 4.5 on the gauge this pool can be waded all the way down to the Stilly. It does get a bit deep half way down but if you keep in you can get past this hole. Not worth trying to wade if the level is much over 5. if this is the case fish as much as you can the go to the next ladder down.

Stilly
The initial run into the pool is the normal hot spot here but they can be found all the way down to the tail. The wading to halfway is reasonably OK, but it does get deep from then on. This is ne of these pools that fishes so nicely you expect to set a fish with every cast. Another pool that is good for night time sea trout.

Diagonal Pool
Easily fished from the bank. Let your fly come right around as there's a gravel bank on our side that they lay up on. Try to keep hidden here. This is a good grilse and sea trout pool.

Trench
From the Diagonal Pool there are pockets to the bottom of the beat that are worth covering. The Trench is a deep gully on the other side which is worth coveringn directly above and below.

Please Note
Access to the beat: Via left as you cross the road from the hotel car park and go through the first gate on the right.

The water level gauge can be seen upstream of the Umberleigh Bridge on the other bank. It is measured in metres and 4.5 would be considered average height. Fish have been caught in the Home, Bridge and Hut pools up to 1.2 metres on the gauge.
